#### **REGISTRATION FEE**

\$285 per child per week.

#### AGE APPROPRIATE LEARNING ENVIRONMENT

Our camp programs are divided by age range. This allows our camp staff to develop the most fun. interactive, and appropriate activities for your child(ren) to best fit with their development and skills. Our camp staff all have experience working with children and are trained in their respective age categories so that your child(ren) receive the best experience possible.

#### **BEFORE AND/OR AFTER CARE**

Our Before and After Care program is designed for the convenience of those who need to drop off children early or pick them up a little later from camp. This program is available from as early as 7:45 am to as late as 5:30 pm and is offered each day of camp. The children will be in a supervised environment and games, videos, and other quiet activities will be provided.

\*This program has a rate of \$5 per morning, \$10 per afternoon, or \$12 AM and PM. \*rate is per child.

#### **OVERNIGHT OPPORTUNITY**

(for Discoverers and BioCamp) Looking to add some camping to your camp? Why not sleepover at the Zoo! Discoverers and BioCamp participants have the option of spending Wednesday overnight in the Serengeti Bush Camp to find out what goes on at the Zoo once the sun goes down. \*This program has a rate of \$70 per child.

#### LUNCHES AND SNACKS

Snacks will be provided daily for all age groups and consist of allergen aware foods and beverages. Children will be treated to a Pizza Pizza lunch on Thursdays (all ages). We encourage children to bring a litterless lunch from home on the other days of camp and a re-useable plastic cup and plate for snack time.
