

# **Toronto Zoo Field Trips – Frequently Asked Questions**

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### **ADMISSION AND BOOKING**

Question: Do you offer a discounted admission rate for schools?

Answer: We are pleased to provide school groups with a discounted admission rate.

#### School Group Admission Rates\*

Elementary (K-8) \$9 Secondary (9-12) \$10 Post-Secondary \$11

One teacher per class receives free admission. For Kindergarten classes, one teacher and one ECE receive free admission. All additional supervisors pay the school group admission rate.

Admission fees are waived for support persons accompanying students with disabilities who require one-on-one support for health and/or safety reasons. Support persons should not be included in the minimum supervisor ratio, as their attention is focused on an individual students

If your students are participating in a school program, additional program fees apply.

Proceeds received from school visits support the operations of the Toronto Zoo, including our ongoing conservation and education initiatives to protect species at home and abroad.

### Question: Who is eligible to receive the school group admission rate?

Answer:

The school group admission rate is available to groups from schools registered with a provincial Ministry of Education or Ministry of Training, Colleges, and Universities, in addition to other education facilities, for the sole purpose of meeting learning requirements outline in a course curriculum. In July and August, school group rates are valid only for education institutions on a modified school year.

#### Question: Do you offer a discounted admission rate for licensed child care centres?

Answer:

Licensed child care centres\* are eligible to receive the \$9.00 school group rate for children aged 3-12 during the 2018-2019 school year (excluding school holidays). During school holidays, licensed child care centres will receive 25% off regular admission rates.

\*Child Care Centres must be licensed with the Ministry of Education and book with a minimum of 10 students to receive the discounted school group rate.

#### Question: How much does parking cost?

Answer:

School buses can park in the main parking lot for free. A \$14.00 parking fee applies to all personal vehicles.

Question: One of my students has a Toronto Zoo membership. Can they use it to cover

the cost of admission?

Answer: Yes, Toronto Zoo memberships are honoured for school groups. Both students and supervisors

can use their membership to cover the cost of admission. Please photocopy all memberships (on a single page if possible) and present to Guest Relations upon arrival. School programs fees will

still apply (if applicable).

Question: How and when do we pay for our visit?

Answer: Deposits are not required for school visits. Full payment is due upon your arrival and is based on the number of students and supervisors present on the day of your visit. If paying by cheque,

refunds will be given for overpayment.

#### **Acceptable Methods of Payment**

- Invoice (schools associated with an Ontario Ministry of Education School Board can be invoiced)
- Credit (American Express, MasterCard, Visa)
- Debit/Interac
- School cheque (payable to *Toronto Zoo*)

Schools that are part of a publically-funded school board in Ontario can be invoiced, however, this must be arranged prior to your visit.

Question: Do I need to book the field trip in advance?

Answer: School visits should be booked at least two weeks in advance to ensure your confirmation

package will arrive prior to your trip. School programs and guided tours should be booked well in

advance, as space is limited.

Question: Are we able to cancel or reschedule our field trip if needed?

Answer: Field trips can be rescheduled or cancelled without penalty. Rescheduling a school program or

guided tour is subject to availability.

Question: How many supervisors are we required to bring?

Answer: For the safety of our student guests and the enjoyment of our public patrons, the supervisor to

student ratio is strictly enforced.

Supervisor Ratios

Grades K to 3 1 supervisor per 5 students
Grades 4 to 8 1 supervisor per 10 students
Grades 9 to 12 1 supervisor per 20 students

\* In the event that your group does not meet these requirements, you will be charged in accordance with the minimum supervisor ratio and a letter will be issued to your school requiring that any further bookings meet this requirement.

The role of the supervisor is to ensure the safety of all students, encourage appropriate behaviour from each student, and model respect for the animals and plants. All students should be accompanied by a supervisor at all times. Any display of inappropriate behaviour will be grounds for expulsion from the Zoo site. Supervisors must be at least 18 years of age.

Question: I am not familiar with Toronto Zoo. Can I visit ahead of time to plan my

field trip?

Answer: To help prepare and plan for a successful field trip, educators who have pre-booked a school

trip are invited to visit the Toronto Zoo for FREE\* ahead of time by presenting a copy of your school visit confirmation letter and a valid OCT card or equivalent Teacher ID card, along with

photo ID, at Guest Relations.

\*Valid for one admission and parking pass per educator, up to the number of qualified complimentary educators indicated in the school visit confirmation package. All educators

attending the planning visit must check in at Guest Relations at the same time

## **GENERAL ZOO INFORMATION**

Question: When is the best time to visit?

Answer: The Zoo is open year-round and is a great place to visit regardless of the weather! The majority

of school groups visit the Zoo in the warmer months of October, May, and June. However, with five indoor pavilions, the Zoo offers a wide variety of animals for your students to explore when it's raining or snowing. In the cooler months, animals tend to be more active and with fewer visitors at the Zoo, students will have the opportunity to spend more time at an exhibit observing the

animals.

Question: Is the Zoo accessible?

Answer: The Zoo has many features that make it accessible for all visitors, including free wheelchairs (with

refundable deposit), automated entry systems on washroom and pavilion doors, ramps in lieu of

stairs, and accessible washrooms.

Additionally, support persons providing one-on-on support to a student for health and/or safety

reasons receive complimentary admission.

Question: What should students bring with them?

Answer: • Appropriate clothing for the season (layers work best)

Backpack

Comfortable walking shoes

Hat

Lunch

Reusable water bottle

Sunscreen

Camera (optional)

Raingear (if needed)

Question: Can we bring our own lunches?

Answer: Absolutely! Students can either bring their own litterless lunch with them or purchase food at one

Question: Where can we eat?

Answer: Picnic tables are available throughout the Zoo. Please refer to the **Zoo map** for details about the

location of picnic tables and picnic shelters.

\*Note: Some picnic areas may be closed for events. Please refer to signs posted at entrance of

picnic area.

Question: Do you have a place to store belongings or lunches?

Answer: Lockers are available to rent at the Main Entrance. However, due to the limited number of lockers

available and the size of Zoo, it is recommended that students carry their belongings with them

during their visit.

Question: Are students able to feed or touch the animals?

Answer: Zoo animals are on specialized diets – any additional food can cause them serious harm or trigger

fighting within the group. Please do not attempt to feed or approach any wild birds or animals on

the Zoo site, as these animals may become aggressive.

Wildlife Care staff often bring Outreach animals out for casual encounters with Zoo visitors. If you spot an animal around the Zoo with Wildlife Care staff, please ensure that your students follow the directions of the keepers, as they are for the safety of both the animal and your students.



Question: Why is an exhibit empty?

Answer: Unless there is an 'Animal off-display' sign in the exhibit, chances are that the animal(s) is on

display, but has found a spot to hide.

In the event of inclement weather, some animals may be off-display or given access to indoor holdings. Animals may also be temporarily off-exhibit due to routine medical check-ups or brief exhibit maintenance. Animals may be off-display for longer periods of time for exhibit renovations.

### **SAFETY**

Question: What happens if a student has a medical emergency or becomes separated

from their group?

Answer: In the event of an emergency, please report to the nearest staff member, use a red emergency

phone (see Zoo map for locations), or call the emergency contact number for Security (provided in your confirmation package). For minor injuries or illnesses, a First Aid Centre is located by the

Africa Restaurant.

If the Zoo needs to contact you during your visit, they will first call the cell phone number provided

to Guest Relations upon arrival and then contact the school directly.
