Zoo Camp - Roles and Responsibilities of Caregivers

Caregivers must check in at the Education Office with the camper on the first day of camp.

As a caregiver:

- 1. You are only responsible for the child in your care.
- 2. Assist in providing a positive and supportive environment for the camper and if necessary, provide support in managing potential behavioural issues for the child in your care.
- 3. Communicate any concerns, needs, issues, and/or feedback that may arise in regards to the child in your care to Zoo Camp Counsellors and/or Education Office staff.
- 4. Please remain with the camper's designated group at all times during camp. Unfortunately, visits to restaurants, gift shops, and/or any other areas of the Zoo not included in the daily Zoo Camp schedule cannot be accommodated.
 - a. If the camper requires quiet time, please liaise with your Zoo Camp counsellors to find an appropriate location. Counsellors must be aware of the whereabouts of both the camper and caregiver at all times.
- 5. To ensure your full attention and to limit the distractions for other campers, the use of electronic devices (including cell phones, cameras, tablets, iPods/MP3 players, etc.), unless being used as an assistive aid for the camper, is strongly discouraged at Zoo Camp. Additionally, photographs of any camper, other than the camper in your care, are not permitted.
- 6. Please meet the Zoo Camp Counsellors on time at the Passenger Drop-off Loop, unless prearrangements are made with Zoo Camp staff. Zoo Camp runs from 9:00 am to 3:30 pm.

7. Please wear the name tag provided at all times so that Toronto Zoo staff can recognize you

as a caregiver.
